Pressing Need

- Assist PD in:
 - Improving School Safety
 - Crime Prevention
 - Follow up Investigations

An Ideal System Would Provide

- Cameras allowing IP Connectivity from:
 - Schools
 - Streets
 - Businesses
- Interface to 911 Center and PD
 - To aid incident response
 - To assist follow up investigations
- Similar programs operating in City of Chicago/
Burbank.
 - Key infrastructure, high crime areas, etc.



Cost Management
